There are two types of grant programs:



Discretionary
Grant Programs
(Competitive)

- Formula grant programs are funded to Urbanized Areas (UZAs) based on formulas using population and National Transit Data submitted.
- Discretionary grant programs are awarded based on meeting application requirements and selected based on criteria specific to the program.



### Formula Grants

Grant Title		Brief Description		
	Metropolitan and Statewide Planning (5303)	Supports cooperative, continuous, and comprehensive planning for making transportation investment decisions.  Historically approx \$225k annually		
	Urbanized Area Formula Program (5307)	Transit capital and operating assistance in urbanized areas and for transportation-related planning and JARC projects.  **Approx \$17 million est. in FY2017*  **.		
	State of Good Repair Program (5337)	Replaces the Fixed Guideway Modernization Formula Program. Capital assistance for maintaining transportation system in a state of good repair.  Approx \$2 million est. in FY2017

Fixed Guideway Capital Investment Grants ("New Starts") (5309) Provides grants for new and expanded rail, bus rapid transit, and ferry systems that reflect local priorities to improve transportation options in key corridors.

(\$0 in FY17)



Bus and Bus Facilities Infrastructure Investment Program (5339) Provides capital funding to replace, rehabilitate and purchase buses and related equipment and to construct bus-related facilities including technological changes or innovations to modify low or no emission vehicles or facilities. The Low- or No-Emission Vehicle Program is a sub-program of this competitive program.

#### FHWA Flexible Funding

#### **Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ)**

- Federal CMAQ funds are apportioned to each state
  according to the severity of its ozone and carbon monoxide
  (CO) problem. Virginia allocates CMAQ funds to
  Metropolitan Planning Areas (MPAs) that have been
  designated as non-attainment or maintenance areas.
  Metropolitan planning organizations, like the HRTPO, are
  responsible for selecting projects for CMAQ funding within
  their MPA.
- To qualify for CMAQ funding, projects must demonstrate improvement in air quality. Transit projects always do well under this program.

*Approx \$28.7 million in FY2018-FY2023* 



## FHWA Flexible Funding

#### **Regional Surface Transportation Program**

RSTP funds are apportioned by the State to the metropolitan planning areas (MPAs) within Virginia. Metropolitan planning organizations, like the HRTPO, are responsible for selecting projects for RSTP funding.

*Approx \$32.7 million in FY2018-FY2023* 



## Examples of Eligible CMAQ and RSTP Projects

- Transit Projects
  - New/Expanded Service
  - Bus Shelters/Facilities
  - Vehicle Replacement /Purchase
  - Fixed Guideway Projects
  - Light Rail Transit
- Planning Studies
- Transportation Demand Management Projects
  - Regional Rideshare
  - Marketing and Outreach Programs
  - HOV Express Bus Service
  - Park-and-Ride Lots
- Intelligent Transportation System Projects
- Bikeway/Pedestrian Facilities (CMAQ only)



## Match Requirements (All Grants)

- Match requirements are set in the grant guidance of the specific programs. Most federal grants require a 20% match that must be met with <u>non-federal</u> sources
- Match requirements are typically met from a combination of state and local sources.
- Programs such as RSTP and CMAQ are 100% matched by the State.



#### State Match

- DRPT provides match for capital projects from the Mass Transit Trust Fund (MTTF).
- The capital match ratio can vary significantly based upon the amount of capital needs for the upcoming fiscal year and any supplemental funding appropriated by the General Assembly and allocated by the Commonwealth Transportation Board.
- Match requirements for Hampton Roads Transit are met from a combination of state and local sources.



#### **Local Match**

- Matching funds are provided by local Advance Capital Contributions (ACC).
- The Cities pay the ACC with their quarterly subsidies.
- The amount of ACC is set in the approval of the operating budget. It is based on a percentage of the asset depreciation.
- Collectively the six cities contribute \$2 million annually



## Allocation of FFY 2017 Formula Funding



- Total Federal Allocation is \$21.1 million
- 73% is supporting
   Operations for Preventive
   Maintenance (PM) and
   Americans with Disability
   Act (ADA)
- 5% supports Bus Lease Purchase payments
- 22% funds capital projects

Release of State Six Year Plan (May) Contracts available for execution (July)

State Application due February 1

FY 18 State Funding

Release of Remainder of Apportionment (June)

FTA slows grant processing in July and Closes TrAM in September TrAM reopens in the October /November time frame

Release of Partial Federal Apportionment (February / March)

FY 17 Funding Allocation
