Danny Plaugher serves as the executive director of both Virginians for High Speed Rail (VHSR) and the Virginia Transit Association (VTA). He joined VHSR in 2007 where he helped to create the Virginia Intercity Passenger Rail Operating and Capital Fund (IPROC) and make Virginia one of the first states with a dedicated funding source for passenger rail. He joined the Virginia Transit Association (VTA) in 2019 to help lead their policy and outreach efforts.

In 2002, he was appointed by Governor Mark R. Warner to serve on the Advisory Committee for Juvenile Justice and was reappointed in 2003, becoming one of the youngest appointees of Governor Warner's administration. Danny serves on numerous community and regional boards including the Megaregion Institutional Council for RVA757 Connects; the Virginia Conservation Network's Legislative and Land Use & Transportation committees; the Capital Region Rail Vision Advisory Committee for the Greater Washington Partnership; fellow and treasurer of the Virginia Rail Policy Institute; and is a proud member of the Virginia Commonwealth University (VCU) Alumni Association.

He has previously served on the Planning Committee for Senator Mark R. Warner's 2013 Virginia Young Professional's Summit, Governor Terry McAuliffe's 2014 Transition Transportation Council, as well as Commonwealth's Smart Scale Workgroup (2023), Transportation Sustainability Workgroup (2019), and Rail Enhancement Task Force (2015). He is also a former member and past President of the Rotary Club of Richmond, one of Virginia's oldest service organizations, and past board member and co-founder of RVA Rapid Transit.

Danny is also a 2014 graduate of Leadership Metro Richmond, a 2014 graduate of the Henrico Citizens Academy, and a 2016 graduate of Henrico's Citizens Fire Academy. In 2011, Danny was honored to be named one of Richmond's Top 40 under 40 by Style Weekly magazine and one of VCU's Top 10 Graduates of the Last Decade in 2016. In 2018, he was made the first honorary member of VCU's Pi Sigma Alpha honor society in the society's 30-year history.

He is a graduate of Virginia Commonwealth University; and he lives in the West End of Henrico with his wife Jan, son Benjamin, and dogs Lily and Oscar.
